VEHICLES: None in campsite. Cards will be issued to be put on cars. All vehicles must have the identification card. This can be picked up at registration. Try to keep group together. Follow directions of traffic directors. A camp vehicle will be available to haul gear in. Private vehicles will be allowed to tow in trailers under our guidance.

CAMPSITE: Campsite selection will be on a first come first serve basis unless you have prepaid TOTAL registration. We will *try to accommodate* your first-choice prepaid registration. Please see map next page to make your selections of 1, 2, or 3 choice and remember you will be sharing the Camp site with another Pack. You will be responsible for keeping the campsite and bathrooms clean.

CAMPFIRE: A Saturday night campfire is planned and will be a BIG part of your weekend. We will have a crossover ceremony for those wishing to cross boys into Boy Scouting. You may have a Scoutmaster or representative from a troop there to welcome the boys. If not, we will provide someone to receive the boys into Boy Scouts. Please note this on your turn-in sheets. Cross-Over's will meet before the Campfire to begin the Trail to Scouting.

An Arrow of Light recognition will also take place. Those boys who achieve these awards will be recognized. We must have your lists of Cross-Over's and Arrow of Light by Friday Cracker-Barrel.

Skits for the campfire are encouraged. They must be turned in for review Saturday afternoon to Registration. Skits may not change when presented from what was submitted.

COMMENTS: No open ground fires except in Fire rings. There may be a fire moratorium in Camp. You will be advised at check in Friday night and At Cracker-Barrel. We will be on a Scout reservation and Scout rules will apply. As a reminder:

Transition Trail

The [Transition Trail](#) is a guided trail into the heart of Camp Elmore. Designed to give the hiker a taste of solitude in the wilderness, the trail also contains a mini course in the environment of South Florida.

The cost of the trail is \$4.00 per person. This is the cost of the patch. Patches will be given out at checkout time.

The trail is open to second year Webelos only. Two adults **MUST** be with the group. Nine is the maximum number of people per group. This means seven boys and two adults. If you have a bunch that wants to go, you will need to break up into groups.

There will be three morning and three afternoon hikes. Pre-registration and pre-payment is a must. First come first served basis. The registration form is on the next page.

Trail Guidelines

1. No soft drink cans or bottles allowed on trail. Bring canteens only.
2. Please wear long pants, hat with brim, sturdy shoes and socks. Expect to get your feet wet. Keep in mind you may want to throw shoes away after hike.
3. A two-quart canteen with water per person is recommended.
4. A small first aid kit per group. Carried by Adult leader.
5. Snacks. Avoid sugar and salty things. Fruit is usually the best.
6. Camera, compass, binoculars are optional, but nice to have.
7. Allow about three hours for the hike.

Getting to Elmore

Coming south from Palm Beach on 95 or the Florida Turnpike, you can get off on SW 10 Street, go west to the Sawgrass express way (Toll Road).

Going south, stay on the Sawgrass express way till you get to Griffin Road EAST about 26 miles. Take that exit.

Go east about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile, (getting over to the left lane as you come up to the light) proceed to the canal cross over bridge just past the light of SW 148 Ave. go over the cross over and turn right onto Orange Drive. Take your first left turn (Boy Scout Road) in about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile Camp Elmore will be on your left right after Vista View Park.

You can also stay on the Turnpike or 95, you want to get off on Griffin Road west. Stay on Griffin Road till you get to South Flamingo Road, about 9 miles from 95 and about 6 miles from the Turnpike. Get into the right lane as you will use the cross over lane after you go thru the light. Turn left onto Orange Road and go about a mile and a $\frac{1}{4}$, turn right on to Boy Scout Road. If you didn't get over to the cross over don't worry as there is another cross over down the road about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles. Take that cross over and turn right and first left that's Boy Scout Road.
